# 1. Disability Car Insurance for Personal Assistants & Carers



Tailored car insurance is available if you are a disabled person who wants to arrange cover that allows a team of carers to drive your vehicle, or a carer who requires insurance for an adapted vehicle. Some insurance companies cover insurance for:

- Parents with disabled children
- Insurance for carers
- Insurance for family members and medical professionals
- Insurance for disabled drivers who require a carer or a team of carers
- Insurance for carers of disabled people

## Benefits of insurance tailored to carers:

Some Insurance Policies are suitable for almost all situations and have great features designed for your needs, including:

- Cover for young disabled drivers from 16 upwards
- 90 days European Green Card Cover
- An appropriate Courtesy Car in the event of an accident (subject to availability)
- Motability Claim-Free driving accepted in lieu of NCB

## Why might you need Insurance for Carers?

- A carer or assistant drives your car regularly or occasionally.
- You may need more than one person to drive your vehicle.
- You need a young driver to be able drive your car.
- You may require cover for family members and medical professionals.
- You may need insurance for any driver to drive your adapted car.

## 2. Independent Living Insurance for Personal Assistants & Employers

### What insurance do you need for hiring a PA or working as one?

Whether you are a self-employed paid carer, care provider or someone who employs a paid carer or personal assistant, something that you need to have in place is the right insurance.

There are a number of companies in the UK which specialise in insurance for the care sector and it is not too expensive – though it is something that will need to be budgeted for.

Its Personal Care Assistant Insurance is designed for self-employed carers and this includes PLI, personal accident cover, legal cost and expenses, accidental bodily damage, accidental damage to property and access to a 24/7 helpline. This costs £85 for a year.

Mrs. N in NE Fife had a team of three agency staff, which she was self-funding and she wanted to change to Option 1 'Becoming an employer' and employ the staff team as Personal Assistants. Mrs N's assessment had been carried out by Social Work and she was eligible for a number of hours a week.

A joint visit followed with our Independent Living Officer, Julia Walker and Social Worker outlining responsibilities of becoming an employer along with useful literature such as our own SDS Options leaflet, Volunteer one and an easy-read SDS brochure at Dundee carers and is a useful guide when explaining all 4 options. As Mrs. N was self-funding originally we advised that cleaning duties would no longer be covered under the SDS budget.

Our HR Representative Zoe Cormack gave support with reviewing the job description which Mrs N's daughter M had derived from Mrs N's Personal Outcomes Plan. Currently contracts are being finalised and starting dates are being agreed.

Mrs N and her daughter M are delighted with the support and service from SDS Options Fife.

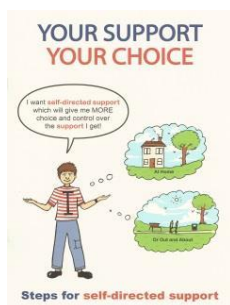

The new Support in the Right Direction Fund (SiRD2021) is open for applications as of 05<sup>th</sup> February. The deadline for applying is 12pm (midday) on Tuesday 3 April 2018.
